What is Selects?



- Investigates electoral behaviour of Swiss citizens since 1995
- Main scientific goals:
 - How do citizens form their opinions in an election campaign?
 - What are the determinants of their political participation?
 - Why do they vote for a specific candidate or party?





 Funded by Swiss National Science Foundation (SNF) and institutionalized at FORS since 2008









What is Selects?

Different components on different levels of analysis:

- 1. Post-Election Survey (citizens): participation, vote choice
- 2. Panel Survey (citizens): dynamics of opinion formation, vote intention/choice during different phases of election cycle, effects of election campaign
- 3. Candidate Survey (political elites): Electoral success, representation, candidates' election campaign
- Social Media Analysis (political elites): Candidates' activities on social media
- 5. Media Analysis (media): Reporting about candidates, parties and election campaign in the media








The Selects Panel Survey

Set-up:


- Original: 3 waves (pre-campaign, election campaign, postelection)
- Innovation: panel will be continued with yearly waves until federal elections 2023



The Selects Panel Survey

Design and Sampling:

- Random sample drawn from sampling register of Swiss Federal Statistical Office (only Swiss citizens living in CH aged 18+)
- Self-administered online survey (DE, FR, IT)



The Selects Panel Survey

Wave 1 (pre-campaign):

- Initial sample size: 25'575
- Response rate: 31% (n=7939)

Wave 2 (election campaign):

- Response rate: 68% (n=5577)

Wave 3 (post-election period):

- Response rate: 65% (n=5125)

Wave 4 (2020 – one year after the federal elections):

- 3030 respondents of W3 gave consent for future waves
- Response rate: 85% (n=2499)









Block of specific COVID-19 questions

- Evaluation of government performance in handling coronavirus pandemic
- To what degree shall civil rights and privacy be restricted?
- Attitudes regarding political decision-making in a democracy in times of a crisis, for example:
 - "Important political decisions should be taken by experts rather than politicians or the people."
 - "Public health always comes first, even if this entails economic costs."
 - "Having a strong leader in government is good, even if she/he bends the rules to get things done."
- Measures to meet climate targets vs. fight economic crisis







Block of specific COVID-19 questions

- Most competent party in handling coronavirus pandemic
- Who should take the lead in handling the crisis?
 - Confederation vs. cantons (centralism vs. federalism)
 - Federal Council vs. Parliament (executive vs. legislative)
- Are changes in respondents' professional situation due to the coronavirus pandemic?
 - Working situation
 - Position at work
 - Profession
 - Household income









Questions that are not COVID-19 specific but the coronavirus pandemic might have induced **changes over time**

- Party preference (probability to vote for different parties, vote intention/choice)
- Most and second most important problem in CH
- Trust in institutions (W3-W4), for example:
 - Federal Council
 - Parliament
 - Political parties
 - Cantonal authorities





Questions that are not COVID-19 specific but the coronavirus pandemic might have induced **changes over time**

- Opinions/attitudes (W3-W4), for example:
 - "The people should make our most important policy decisions, not the politicians."
- Political values (W1-W4), for example:
 - State interventions in the economy vs. free market competition
- Perceived national economic conditions (last/next 12 months)
 (W1-W4)








Data availability
